# FSU Tallahassee classes & schedules to resume Monday, Sept. 30

Florida State University will resume regular operations Monday, Sept. 30. The Tallahassee campus will be fully operational and classes will meet as scheduled. While power has been restored to the majority of campus, university administrators are aware that some students living off campus, as well as faculty and staff, may not yet have power in their homes. City of Tallahassee officials are confident that most of the city will have power restored before Monday. Many Tallahassee businesses, including grocery stores and gas stations are open around the city.

Instructors are encouraged to be flexible with students who may not be able to return to campus by Monday. Supervisors are encouraged to be generous in approving annual leave for employees who are unable to return to work in the aftermath of Hurricane Helene. FSU reminds everyone to please travel safely.

#### **FREQUENTLY ASKED QUESTIONS**

#### Q. What if special circumstances warrant missing class?

A. Any student who will not be attending classes while the university is in operation needs to contact the instructor in advance by e-mail or Canvas messages to explain the circumstances and discuss the implications of missing class as early as possible.

### Q. I'm enrolled in an online course but have lost power and/or online access at my home due to the hurricane. What do I do?

A. Contact your instructor as soon as possible to report your situation. The university will work to accommodate distance learning students with problems arising from hurricanes and other natural disasters.

Florida State University's Tallahassee campus is closed, due to Hurricane Helene. Limited campus services are available. Please scroll down for adjusted operating schedules.

The **closure will continue until 11 p.m. ET Sunday, Sept. 29**. The university expects to resume normal business operations at 12:00 a.m. Monday, Sept. 30, 2024. The Marine Lab at Turkey Point will also be closed on these dates. If changes to operations are needed at other campus locations, targeted communications will follow.

Essential business operations will continue during the closure. Vice Presidents and Deans will provide guidance for their respective divisions and colleges. Employees designated by their department as essential personnel should consult with their supervisors.
